SPORTSPERSON OF THE YEAR AWARD

The name of the successful student is recorded on School Honour Board in the Tharawal School hall. The recipient is selected from Year 6 and has met all of the following criteria:

GENERAL COMMENT:

This award is presented for all round sporting ability, sportsmanship, fair play and support for sporting activities in the school. It includes outstanding performances in:

- 1. One or more interschool sports. This may be a regular P.S.S.A. team, representative team (district, region, state or national) or knockout team.
- 2. School and/ or class sport activities.
- 3. Their attitude to participation in sporting activities including fair play (sportsmanship), commitment and associated training.
- 4. Their overall support for general sport organisation, fostering of sport activities and assisting others in lower grades of the school.

DHARAWAL AWARD

This award is presented to a student who has an Australian Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander background and has been a role model for other students. They have been a kind, respectful, interested and committed learner who has also upheld Tharawal Primary School expectations.

CULTURAL AWARDS

GENERAL COMMENT:

These awards are given to the students who demonstrate a high level of commitment, overall development and enthusiasm in a particular area.

CLASS AWARDS (YEARS 1 - 6)

These awards are presented in recognition of academic excellence* (one given) then two other awards for students in recognition of their achievement/application in line with our Learning Powers or PBL values. In addition, each class teacher will award one citizenship prize**. This totals four awards per class including composite classes for years 1 - 6.

GRADUATION CERTIFICATES

All Kindergarten students will receive a Graduation Certificate. No other class awards will be given however, citizenship awards are given in Kindergarten

TROPHIES:

Individual students or teams are presented with a trophy/s in recognition of outstanding personal achievement.

For representing in a Regional (Sydney East) Team.
 If the student succeeds at the Regional level and becomes a N.S.W. representative for a National competition this will be stated on the plaque attached to the trophy.

^{*}In composite/stage classes, two academic excellence awards are given (one from each grade), one citizenship and one other class award.

^{**}Citizenship awards will also be included in Years 1 – 5 class awards. They are also awarded in Kindergarten.

- If a child has represented the school at Regional level in more than one sport or event these will be included on the same trophy.
- For representing in a Regional or State Team. If the student succeeds at the Regional level and becomes a N.S.W. representative for a cultural activity eg dance, band or choir. This will be stated on the plaque attached to the trophy.
